



WHAT IS A HEALTH AND SAFETY REPRESENTATIVE?

A workplace Health and Safety Representative (HSR) is an employee who has been elected by their work group to represent them in health and safety matters. Duties include:

- Representing workers on health and safety matters
- Make recommendations to the employer regarding health and safety in the workplace
- Working with employers to ensure that health and safety is well managed in the workplace

About this course

This course prepares workplace Health and Safety Representatives to be able to explain their overall role and functions in a New Zealand workplace. The course is NZQA-approved, and all credits will be registered with NZQA.
